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CHAPTER 1

Getting Started

Note: You need an account on HelixWare or a compatible server in order to be able to use this plugin.

Compatibility

HelixWare is compatible with WordPress 3.9 and later.

Installation


Download the provided zip file to the `wp-content/plugins` directory of your [WordPress](#) installation. Unzip the file, from the command line:

```
unzip helixware.zip
```

Activation

From the WordPress administration menu, click on *Plugins / Installed Plugins*. Then click on *Activate* on the HelixWare plugin.

If the plugin is successfully activated you should see the following banner below the title in the admin screens:

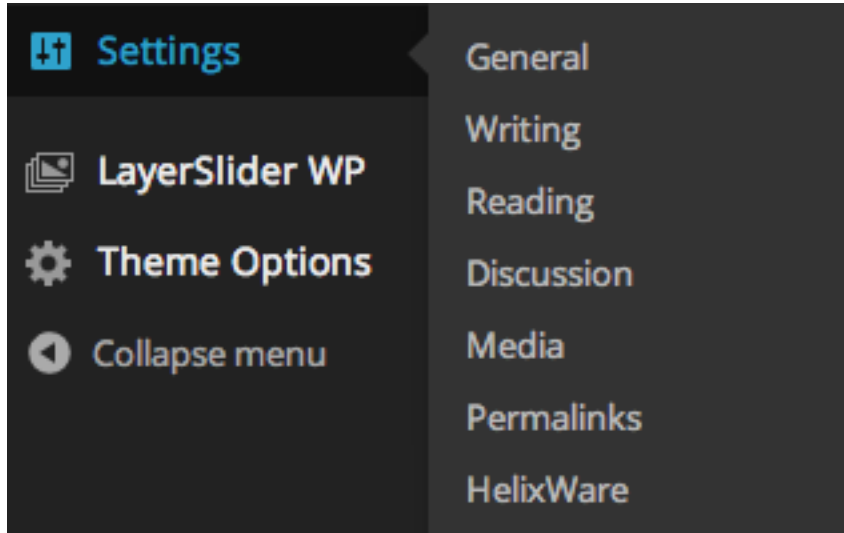


HelixWare Quota: You have 94% of free space (9.42Gb out of 10Gb total).

Note: Until HelixWare is correctly configured, the banner will show *loading...* instead of the quota value.

Configuration

Hover on the *Settings* menu from the left bar, a menu will open. Click on *HelixWare* to open the settings screen:



From this screen you can set the following settings:

HelixWare Options

HelixWare Quota: You have 93% of free space (9.29Gb out of 10Gb total).

General settings

Set here the basic settings for HelixWare including the URL for HelixWare Server and the application data.

Server URL	<input type="text" value="https://example.org/api"/>
Application Key	<input type="text" value="abcdefghijkl"/>
Application Secret	<input type="text" value="1234567890"/>

Server URL The URL to the HelixWare server API.

Application Key Your application key.

Application Secret Your application secret.

Configure all the settings with the values that the HelixWare team will provide to you. Don't forget to save the changes by clicking on *Save Changes*.

Note: After saving the HelixWare quota bar should show how much space is available in your account. If it displays

loading for an indefinite time, it means that the account data might not be valid. Please check with the HelixWare team is such a case.

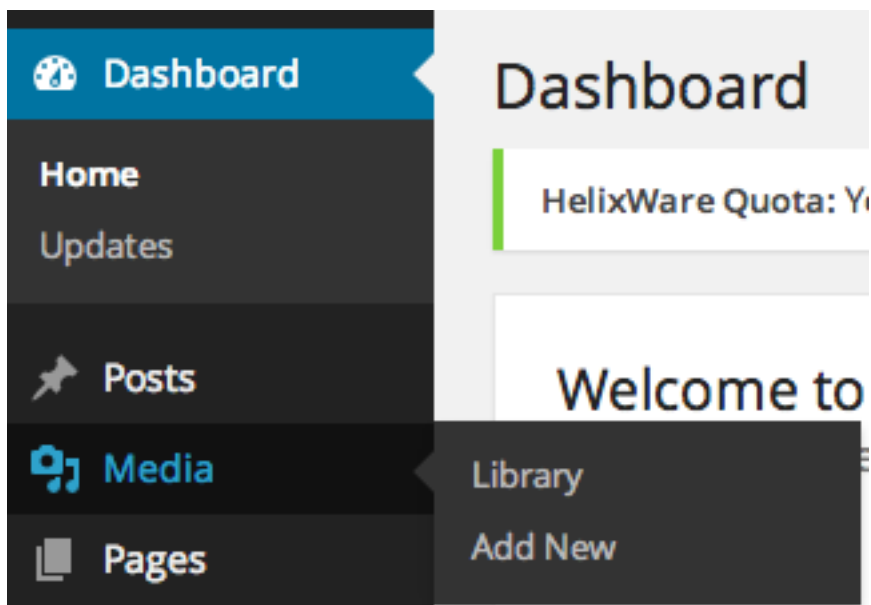
CHAPTER 2

Uploading Videos

Note: HelixWare is integrated in WordPress, the upload of videos is performed using the well-known *Add New Media* page of WordPress.


WordPress login

Log into the WordPress admin screen, and click on *Media / Add New* from the left side menu:



Upload


Drag (or select) one or more videos from your computer on the *Drop files here* box:



Note: The WordPress standard upload limit does not apply to HelixWare uploads. The HelixWare upload limit is specified right after WordPress limit and is usually more than one GB.


Progress

The upload will start, a bar will show its progress:



Create post

When the upload is complete, you can create a new *post* by selecting its type, title and tags. Then click on *Save*:



Note: HelixWare plugin will create a post with the video player shortcode embedded in its content. HelixWare plugin will also create a video thumbnail (by default using the frame at 15”) that will be set as *featured image*.

Edit post

When the post is saved, an *edit* link appears. You can click this link to open the *edit post* screen.
