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This document explains how to install and use [openstandard.mozilla.org](http://openstandard.mozilla.org).



## 1.1 Installing The Open Standard Theme

### 1.1.1 Pre-Requisites

- WordPress === 4.0
- All Reqs To Support WordPress

### 1.1.2 Installation

Clone the wordpress theme & plugins directory:

```
git clone https://github.com/mozilla/theopenstandard.git
```

Move plugins and theme files to the appropriate place for your local development.

## 1.2 Stylus

### 1.2.1 Installation

Run “npm install” from the theme directory

### 1.2.2 Development / Compilation

If this is the first time you’re compiling, ensure you’ve met all of the requirements for compiling with grunt, then follow these getting started instructions: <http://gruntjs.com/getting-started#working-with-an-existing-grunt-project>

Type “grunt” in theme directory. This watches for changes to any .styl file and compiles blog.styl

## 1.4 Content Editing

### 1.4.1 Articles

Articles should be easy-peasy to edit in wordpress. Below are the items specific to our theme.

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#### Full & Short Titles

There are 2 titles for each article, the full title (used on the article page) and the short title used everywhere else. If a short title is not supplied the long title will be used.

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#### Deck

The `excerpt` field is used for the deck and is required.

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#### Categories

Articles are assigned categories via the checkboxes on the right side. If you specify more than one category you should pick one category as primary. The primary category is where the article appears in navigation and search. To select a primary category scroll down in the edit interface until you see `Categories`. Select the primary category from the dropdown.

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## Content

The following codes allow you to manipulate the contents of the articles.

### Shortcodes

[post\_gallery id="ID HERE"] will insert a gallery in the post.

### Blockquotes

Blockquote tags will be pulled to the side and have a share button added to them.

They will maintain their vertical position within the flow of the document, and the content below them will collapse to fill in the space they occupied.

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**Note:** {fill in number of blockquotes allowed and if their position in the copy matters}.

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### Block Grids

Block grids can be created by putting `: : ` at the beginning of a P tag. All consecutive p tags that start with `: : ` will be put into the same block grid.

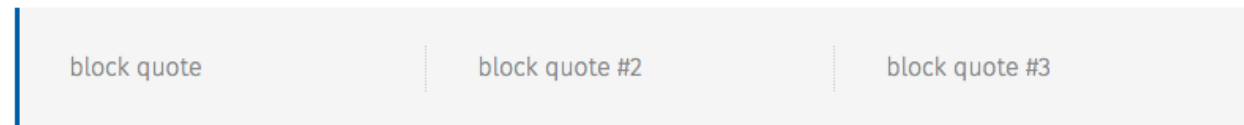

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## Hero Images & Thumbnails

Each article “usually” has a hero image. To set this image for an article add it as the `featured_image`. Note this image is used as the thumbnail, inserted into the rss feed and in other places.

Since the various image sizes are generated upon upload, you should upload a large and high quality (Max Size 25mb).

## Featured Articles

- Articles assigned the “Featured” category will be featured on the article listing page for that category (the primary one set for that article).
- The newest featured article from each category will be shown on the home page.
- The newest article that has the category “HP Lead” will be the primary post on the home page.

## Sponsored Articles

Sponsored articles should have the required information entered into the sponsor custom field.

- URL - when clicked where the thumbnail goes.
- Logo - the logo that will appear on the article page. Dimensions should be 124x124.
- **Note:** the “Sponsored” category must also be selected.

## Related Posts

These are user-defined articles that show at the bottom of the post with a thumbnail and short title.

**To add posts related to the current one you’re editing:**

1. Click the “Add Related Posts” button on the article editing page.
  2. If only adding one related post: hover over a single item and click on the `Link Post` link that appears. This will immediately link that post and bring you back to the article editing page.
  3. If adding multiple related posts: use the checkboxes to select several posts, then choose `Link Posts` in the dropdown menu and click `Apply`.

## 1.4.2 Categories

Categories may be edited by navigating to `posts -> categories`.

Categories at launch include:

- Engage
- Featured
- Innovate
- Learn
- Live
- Opinion

Each category must have a name and a description.

## Special Categories

There are a few special-purpose categories that must exist.

- Sponsored `sponsored` - for sponsored articles.
- HP Lead `hp_lead` - for the main article featured on the home page.
- HP Featured `hp_featured` - featured stories on the home page (most recent by category).
- HP Recent `hp_recent` - most recent stories on the home page sorted by published date.
- Featured `featured` - to feature articles on the category listings page.

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**Note:** If `hp_featured` category is omitted the homepage will display the latest articles with the featured category. If `hp_recent` is omitted the homepage will display the most recent articles.

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## 1.4.3 Comments

Comments are moderated according to the following settings:

Discussion Settings Help ▾

**Default article settings**

- Attempt to notify any blogs linked to from the article
- Allow link notifications from other blogs (pingbacks and trackbacks)
- Allow people to post comments on new articles

*(These settings may be overridden for individual articles.)*

**Other comment settings**

- Comment author must fill out name and e-mail
- Users must be registered and logged in to comment (Signup has been disabled. Only members of this site can comment.)
- Automatically close comments on articles older than  days
- Enable threaded (nested) comments  levels deep
- Break comments into pages with  top level comments per page and the  page displayed by default

Comments should be displayed with the  comments at the top of each page

**E-mail me whenever**

- Anyone posts a comment
- A comment is held for moderation

**Before a comment appears**

- Comment must be manually approved
- Comment author must have a previously approved comment

The author of an article will receive an email notification of comments requiring moderation. You can moderate comments by navigation to `Comments` in the admin.

### 1.4.4 Around The Web

Around The Web is intended to provide a place to manually link to content on other sites *around the web*. This works through menus assigned to the home page and each of the category pages.

#### To add *Around The Web* content:

1. Go to Appearance -> Menus
2. Choose the appropriate *Around The Web* menu from the dropdown menu
3. Choose the “Links” section on the left
4. Add the URL and Link Text for the content you’re linking (both required)
5. Click Add to Menu
6. Drag-drop to reorder the menu as needed
7. Click Save Menu

### 1.4.5 Galleries

Galleries, once created, may be inserted into the body of a post using the shortcode `[post_gallery id=gallery_id_here]`

### 1.4.6 Homepage

The homepage has 3 areas that can be actively managed.

1. HP Lead
2. HP Featured
3. HP Recent

### HP Lead

The HP Lead story is the latest story in the special category `hp_lead`.

### HP Featured

The featured stories are the latest stories in each category with the special category `hp_featured`. If no story in the given category has `hp_featured` then falls back to the most recent story with the `featured` category.

### HP Recent

The most recent stories are stories sorted by published date with the `hp_recent` category

### Featured Articles By Topic

The newest articles with the `featured` category will be shown on each category landing page in the Featured section.

## 1.4.7 Users

For the purposes of content editing there are 3 user roles we use:

1. Editor - our paid staff, somebody who can publish and manage posts including the posts of other users.
2. Author - folks who have content published on TOS but it's entered/managed by our editors. These users never login.
3. Contributor – folks who have content published on TOS but it must be reviewed by an editor before being published. These users do login.

### Authors

If you have received content from an outside author and need to enter it into wordpress, this section is for you!

To accomplish the above you must create the user in a unique way. Usually when a user is created an email is sent with login instructions. Because this user will never login we will use a dummy email address.

### Create The Author Account

1. In the admin navigate to `Users` and click the `Add New` button at the top of the page.
2. **Under the second section `Add New User` fill out the following information:**
  - (a) Username - all lower case concatenate the first and last name `benjaminsterthal`
  - (b) Email - use the following email `TOSEditors+username@mozilla.com` example `TOSEditors+benjaminsterthal@mozilla.com`
  - (c) Role - select `Author`.

- (d) Check this box - Add the user without sending an email that requires their confirmation.
- (e) Save - do not upload a profile image from this screen.

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**Important:** Wordpress will always send out an email with login information, since these users are not logging in you must always use the email `TOSEditors+username@mozilla.com`

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**Important:** Wordpress will send an email to the editor account. This email should be ignored.

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**Note:** Comment moderation emails will be sent to `TOSEditors+username@mozilla.com` for their respective articles.

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### Populate The Author Account

Once the author account is created you can edit it to add biographical information and a photo.

1. In the admin navigate to `Users All Users` and `Edit` the author.
2. **Add the following required information**
  - (a) Image
  - (b) First Name Last Name
  - (c) Display Name Publicly As
  - (d) Biographical Information
3. **Add the following optional information**
  - (a) Twitter
  - (b) Facebook
  - (c) G+

## 1.5 Plugin Settings

### 1.5.1 Contact Form 7

Provides the contact us form. Note we use Akismet to cut down on spam with this form.

- Enable plugin
- **Go to Contact -> Contact Forms**
  1. Paste the html below in the Form textarea
  2. Save the form
  3. Copy the provided shortcode into the Contact Us page

## 1.5.2 Extra User Details

Adds extra user fields (for us social media) to the user profile.

Under `User -> Extra User Details` add the following custom fields.

Meta Key	Field Name	Description
twitter	Twitter URL	Full Twitter URL
facebook	Facebook URL	Full Facebook URL
googleplus	Google Plus URL	Full G+ URL

## 1.5.3 Featured Images in RSS w/ Size and Position

This plugin inserts the featured image for a post into the RSS feed. Note these feeds are used by the mozilla.org homepage.

The plugin uses the “story-rss” image size specified in the functions.php file. This image size is 460px wide with no restriction on height.

- Enable plugin
- **Go to Settings -> Featured Images In Rss Feeds**
  1. Select “story-rss”
  2. Select “Image Centered Above Text”

## 1.5.4 Password Protected

This plugin password protects all pages on the blog and is only used during the initial population of the production site.

We do not password protect the RSS feed.

- Enable plugin
- **Go to Settings -> Password Protected**
  1. Enable “Password Protected Status”
  2. Protected Permissions Enable “Allow Administrators”
  3. Enter A Password

### 1.5.5 Related Posts

This plugin allows users to associate related articles.

- Enable plugin
- **Go to Settings -> Related Posts**
  1. Uncheck “Enable”
  2. Erase contents of “Heading Text”
  3. Erase contents of “CSS”

### 1.5.6 Simple Fields

This plugin provides simple custom fields to the editing interface. For example “sponsored” and “short title”.

- **Enable plugin**
  1. Go to settings->Simple Fields
  2. Import simple-fields-export.json from themes->theopenstandard->imports
  3. Set “Default Post Connector” for Posts to “Simple Fields” - as follows:

#### Post Type Defaults

Post type	Default Post Connector
Posts	Simple Fields
Pages	No connector
Media	No connector
Related Posts for WordPress Link	No connector
Galleries	Gallery Fields

### 1.5.7 Wordpress SEO

This plugin provides automatic generation of many standard meta tags
